16:00 – 17:15 SESSION 2 – ELECTRONIC TRAVEL AUTHORISATIONS AND E-VISAS – PATHWAY TO VETTING BY AI OVERLORDS?

For the last 15 years, the United States and Canada spearheaded electronic travel authorisation (ETA) programmes for visa-exempt travellers, while India pioneered the e-visa. However, commencing in 2024, the United Kingdom finally launched its own ETA programme, with the European Union to follow with its own programme for the Schengen Area in 2026. This session shall provide a multinational state of play concerning ETA programmes and e-visas, and insights on the future integration of AI into their respective processing.
