Banking and Financial Services Law  Room Mueble 2	Revolution in the payments landscape in the Digital Age Payment services play a fundamental role in our daily lives and for the economy. The payment services market has changed significantly in recent years. Electronic payments have been constantly growing. The trend towards digitalisation was accelerated by the COVID-19 pandemic, leading to a surge in online transactions and contactless payments in shops. The digital transformation is triggering a revolution in the financial sector, especially in payments, which will bring innovation as well as benefits in terms of costs, convenience, accessibility, and inclusion for individuals and firms, but also risks (e.g. fraud). New providers, enabled by digital technologies, have entered the market. Fintech companies have sparked the latest wave of innovation, speeding up the evolution of the payment system that also plays to the strength of big tech. To advance digital payments, promote innovation and enhance safety and efficiency in the financial sector, central banks have multiple tools at their disposal. One prominent option is to issue a Central Bank Digital Currency (CBDC). Another is to build Fast Payment Systems (FPS). Speakers will illustrate the most significant innovations in payments and their key impacts and implications on users, banks and other payment service providers, regulators, and the overall structure of the payments market, as well as the major public-private partnerships in payment systems. Agrifood Law / Animal Law / Environment and Sustainable Development Law  Room Construcción	Sustainable Use of the Oceans The importance of the oceans to human health and well-being cannot be overstated. Covering 70% of the planet, the oceans provide livelihoods and resources to more than 3 billion people. Blue foods – those that are harvested from oceans, rivers, and lakes – have the potential to help feed a population expected to reach 10 billion in 2050. Recognizing its significance, UN Sustainable Development Goal 14 is to “Conserve and sustainably use the oceans, seas and marine resources for sustainable development.” However, due to human activities, the oceans and the creatures who live in them are in peril. Unsustainable exploitation, climate change, and environmental degradation are immediate threats that require international collaboration and cooperation. This presentation will look at key legal and policy issues relevant to the sustainable use of the oceans. The panel of experts will consider the current “state of the blue food industry” – from local economic impacts to international trade agreements. 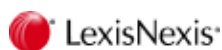

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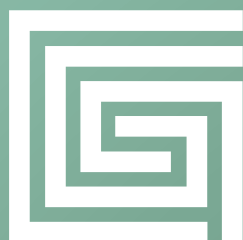

Criminal Law / Human Rights  Room Moda	Contextualised justice: due process and the nature of the offence The idea that due process is not a monolithic concept, but rather that its application may vary in intensity according to the nature of the offence, is a complex and relevant issue. On the one hand, there is the fundamental principle that all persons deserve a fair trial and due process, regardless of the offence with which they are charged. However, it is also true that the seriousness of an offence and its potential consequences may justify a more rigorous application of due process. For example, in a capital case, the need to ensure that a miscarriage of justice does not occur is much greater than in a misdemeanor case. This may warrant a greater investment of resources and time to ensure a fair and thorough process. However, it is crucial to strike a balance. An excessively flexible application of due process could lead to discrimination and infringement of fundamental rights. Therefore, any adjustment in the intensity of due process must be based on objective and justified criteria, always respecting the fundamental principles of justice and human rights.
