09:15 – 10:45 Cross-Border Litigation: an Overview

US technology and new economy companies find themselves subject to a variety of legal and regulatory regimes when operating in non-US jurisdictions and often face litigation either partly or entirely in non-United States courts or agencies, many times in two or more countries. In-house counsel have to face a variety of substantive legal and logistical issues: how to identify cross-border issues and reconcile the requirements of different regimes, how to select and coordinate lawyers operating in different jurisdictions regarding the same or related issues, and how to ensure that their US and non-US lawyers work together seamlessly. In addition, they face practical questions such as different ethical, privilege and expert witness rules and conflicting discovery and evidence – gathering requirements, as well as more day-to-day issues like document translation and data review. The first session will explore how in-house counsel navigate these difficult issues with their local and foreign counsel and forensic experts.

The increasing use of technology in the workplace is raising a whole host of employment issues which in turn is generating complicated cross-border disputes, for example, when an employer in the US has an employee abroad, in a jurisdiction where privacy and labor issues may be entirely different. New questions are arising every day in this area. The use of algorithms in the process of hiring and evaluating employee performance and the gathering of biometric data of employees is leading to challenges under different national standards. The monitoring of employees at work and the mix of private and work-related data in that context across borders is also challenging. The multiple devices and platforms on which employees conduct business on behalf their employers or refer to work related matters raises issues in transnational litigation process. How do in-house counsel and US and foreign employment counsel face these litigation challenges?

15:30 – 17:00 Data Privacy and Platform Liability

Two important and interrelated areas of cross-border litigation are new international and European rules governing data privacy and differing regimes regarding platform liability (i.e. the liability of online platforms and networks for the alleged misconduct of platform users). Litigation arising from data privacy is increasing, and litigation is just arising under the new GDPR rules, which is generating confusion and uncertainty – but some general guidelines seem to be taking shape. Privacy regulations often run directly contrary to other interest such as broad discovery requirements in the US or the need to respond to anonymous whistleblower complaints. Many of these issues are just getting fleshed out. Platform liability, on the other hand, has been litigated extensively in both the US and abroad, and companies often face competing principles, rulings and agency approaches. How can a US company wend its way through this web of competing interests and requirements? What role does outside counsel play?

09:00 – 10:30 **Criminal Law Investigations, Compliance and Litigation**

US companies have been targeted in criminal prosecutions abroad, or required to provide evidence as third-party witnesses, often under regimes in which a broader range of conduct is subject to criminal penalties. In other matters, they have been victimized by others' criminal conduct and are seeking relief in foreign courts. The laws governing such prosecutions are often entirely different than in the United States, including with respect to standards of proof, methods of evidence gathering, privilege against self-incrimination, immunity, plea bargaining, and debarment. What are the areas that may give rise to criminal investigations or prosecutions? How can US companies best deal with the prospect of foreign prosecution and demands for evidence in a criminal case? What role does the new global emphasis on compliance play?

11:00 – 12:30 **Intellectual Property Litigation**

US companies have a strong interest in protecting their intellectual property around the world, not just in the United States, but they often run up against different legal regimes and unfamiliar substantive and procedural rules. For example, US companies operating in Europe sometimes seek to limit their exposure to EU IP laws and proceedings in national European courts. However, EU IP laws increasingly include mandatory and public policy provisions that seek to ensure that those doing business in the EU cannot avoid the principles of those laws by contracting out of the m or by seeking to exclude the jurisdiction of EU member states' courts to determine IP rights issues. One example of this trend among many others is the new Directive on Copyright in the Digital Single Market. The panel will provide an overview of the challenges US companies face in cross-border IP litigation, including specific issues such as the EU's legislation in this area, and their response to the trend at both the legal and practical levels.


