



PART 1- THE TRUTH AND THE LAW - THE US PRESIDENTIAL ELECTIONS AND SOCIAL MEDIA

The extraordinary events arising out of the recent U.S. presidential election raise important questions about truth, conspiracy theories, and lies, as well as the role and responsibility of social media in informing (or misinforming) public debate. Historically, social media in the United States have enjoyed broad legal immunity for content shared on their platforms. In recent years, however, many on both ends of the political spectrum have clamored for greater legal responsibility. Some have criticized social media for allowing hate speech or incitement of violence to proliferate. Others have argued that social media abuses its immunity to engage in selective censorship, suppressing some viewpoints while tolerating others. Those debates have fundamental ramifications for both the survival of democratic institutions and the tradition of free expression on which American democracy is based. These two presentations will explore those issues and invite participants to exchange their own views, especially from the perspective of their own jurisdiction.

- > In order to pay for the selected services your bank details will be deleted after receipt of your payment;
- > In order to communicate information messages from UIA.

To the extent necessary for the execution of their respective tasks, our subcontractors in charge of our Event organisation, our IT infrastructure, our management, the production and maintenance of our website and extranet, are likely to gain access to your data from time to time. Their servers are located in the European Union.

Data relating to your participation in the event shall be stored for a period of 10 years. We are obliged to archive billing data until the end of the period required for our tax and accounting obligations, i.e. for 7 full tax years. We shall store your contact information to keep you informed until you ask us to stop. You have the right to access your data and have it corrected if necessary.
